

Obtaining Moorage at the CFSA

The first step to obtaining moorage at the CFSA is to become a member. You can click the “Join Us” tab on our website, or contact the Membership Chair by email at membership@cfsaesq.ca

Once you have membership, you must also have a boat. CFSA can’t “save you a spot” in the event that you will purchase a boat in the future.

Contact the Wharfinger _____ by email at moorage@cfsaesq.ca _____. S/he will let you know about moorage availability. This will depend on your membership type: Regular Serving, Regular, Ordinary, or Associate; the size of slip you require, and if there are any unoccupied slips.

You might be able to move in right away, you might be told there will be a 30 day wait, or you might need to go onto the waitlist. Regardless, you will need to prepare the following for submission to the Moorage Committee Chair:

1. The current year’s Moorage Application (available on the website under The Club/Foreshore)
2. A copy of your current insurance showing a minimum of two-million dollars in liability.
3. A copy of your Pleasure Craft Operator’s Certification (PCOC) or its equivalent.

Submit the copies to the Wharfinger _____ either by email at moorage@cfsaesq.ca _____ or in person.

Once these documents have been received, you will be either placed on the wait list or permitted to bring your boat to your assigned slip at the marina.

Make sure to read the following documents:

- Moorage Rates and Rules
- CFSA Power Consumption and Cord Regulations
- Boat Repair and Maintenance

It would also be to your benefit to familiarize yourself with our website and Constitution.
